For organizations, it means rethinking workflows that were designed around manual steps, and building new habits around reviewing and directing AI output rather than producing everything from scratch.

None of this is without friction. Questions about accuracy, accountability, and job design are very real, and the organizations that benefit most will be the ones that pair these tools with clear guardrails and thoughtful oversight rather than treating them as a magic fix.
